Sharing Photographs: (I want to share my photographs with others?)

Purpose

Sharing photographs is making the commitment to the selected photographs that these photographs are good enough. These photographs represent what I see and feel about the subject. "I want to share these photographs with you."

There is always the balance between perfect, good enough, and laziness, at some point it is necessary to evaluate and share your photographs. The motivation to share improves the entire photographic process. By making your photographs available you will be able to review and reflect upon what you have done.

In order to make money with photography it is also necessary to share. There are different methods and different tools for sharing. Whether you are sharing for personal, artistic, or commercial reasons many of the issues and tools are similar. Fundamentally it is important to create a consistent identity that can be discovered and shared.
